From the Pastor's Desk

The baptismal font can be like an oasis in the starkness of the season of lent. On Valentine's Day we also celebrate the holy day of Ash Wednesday, a reminder that we are made of dust, and to dust we shall one day return. A dichotomy like these two holidays falling on the same day, might make you think that Ash Wednesday is not a day full of love and hope, but Ash Wednesday reminds me that I am not to worry about anything because I am not God! The God of love however is about to show us what true love is. Lent carries those stories of love to us. And the baptismal waters, well they refresh the dust. The waters turn dust into pliable mud to be shaped and reformed by God.

I know that's a lot of flowery language, so let me set it in plain language. In this coming season of lent we will be hearing stories from the ancient texts of the Bible. Kicking it off on the first Sunday in lent, we will hear about God's promise to Noah. Yes, Julie, when you asked if it would be appropriate to lead a bible study in lent about Noah, you didn't even know that the Holy Spirit was working through you, did you? How about that? Our second Sunday in lent brings us to Abram and Sarai given a promise by God and celebrated with new names - Abraham and Sarah! This is a reminder that at the font we are called out by name and given promises by the very same God who called out Abraham and Sarah. Are you seeing a common theme here with water and the word? I'll leave you with these two examples, and we'll see if you can find any other connections to baptism over the coming weeks of lent. continued on page 2





Financial Report

Below is a review of the 2023 Finances.

2023 was a year with strong results. We finished the year just shy of \$12,000 to the positive. We had 7 positive months and 5 months where we spent more than we received.

• The budget for 2024 came to almost \$150,600. That means each month we need 12,550 in receipts to cover our actual expenses. Out of the total, \$54,000 are for the mortgage (36%) and \$57,236 are for Pastor Jenni and supply pastors (38%). Receipts (or giving) in 2023 were almost \$160,000. We need to stay vigilant with

watching the finances as we are working with a thin margin.

- The Balance of the Endowment is \$93,730.
- The balance owed on the mortgage is \$502,943.
- Please remember that we have online giving options available for use. This is a great under-utilized option to look into if you are out of town traveling often or don't want to worry with an envelope. Please remember that the church's expenses occur weekly regardless of attendance (Pastor, electricity, insurance, etc.). Online giving through Tithe.ly or Paypal is a good way to give on a consistent basis. Links are on bsulc.org to both online giving options.

For a more in-depth look at the finances (both receipts and expenses), please look for the council minutes and financial report to be posted the Sunday following the council meeting each month. The reports will be posted on the bulletin board by the water fountain. See Mike or Mark if you have additional questions.
