BSULC ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING NOTES - SUNDAY, JANUARY 16, 2022

BSULC's Annual Congregation Meeting was held on Sunday January 16th, immediately following worship services. Julie Barrick, council president, thanked Rae Ann Brougher for her hard work in producing the Annual Congregation Report as well as all of the advertising for various events throughout the year. Copies of the Annual Report and the 2022 bookmark that includes our yearly events were distributed and are available at the church for those who did not receive them. The congregation was encouraged to review the committee reports found in the Annual Report as a lot of great work was accomplished throughout the year.

Lisa Ellerman reported on the Lutheran Research Task Group, which was developed from the feedback gathered at the small group ministry meals last August. The report provides comparisons between several Lutheran denominations and is available if anyone is interested in reviewing it. The report is for information purposes only and does not make any recommendations. The next meeting is scheduled for Jan 25 and is open to anyone who may be interested in attending.

Julie updated the congregation on the status of our current pastoral care - Pastor Richard Michael and Pastor Jim Richards are willing to supply for Sundays for the next month or so. Bishop Jim Dunlop and Pastor Beth Martini from the Synod office are working to identify potential interim candidates.

The annual financial review noted that we ended the year

with \$9,000 over expenses, despite incurring \$15,000 expenses to replace the HVAC and address those needs. This excess was mostly due to not having the full costs related to pastoral care for much of the year. The proposed budget was presented and approved. It was noted that we continue to pay on our mortgage but at the current rate, it will be approximately 10 years until it is paid off (which is necessary to be eligible to borrow additional funds to complete the sanctuary). It was suggested that we hold a campaign or challenge to raise funds specific for the current mortgage.

Council member elections were held. Layne Barrick and Mike Zeigler both completed their second 3-year terms and were thanked for their service. Mike Zeigler will remain as Treasurer which is an appointed position. Lauren Zeigler and Rae Ann Brougher both completed their first 3-year term and both were agreeable to accept nominations for a 2nd term. Richard Butts was also agreeable to accept the nomination. All three were unanimously voted onto council.

The congregation was reminded that Council Meetings are held the second Monday each month at 7:00 pm at the church. The meetings are open to everyone and all are welcome to attend.

Everyone was given a Member Trivia sheet and asked to complete 3 facts about themselves that others may not know. This sheet will be used in the future to learn more about each other.

Everyone was also reminded that their offering envelopes and summary of giving statements are available in the vestibule.



Financial Report

Below is a review of the 2021 financials.

2021 was a strong financial year for our church. In December alone, we had a surplus of over \$9,000! Seven out of 12 months have been positive financial months. If you take out the large one time HVAC expense, that makes 8 out of 12 months have had positive receipts. For 2021 in total, we are \$9,618.72 above expenses. Our receipts in 2021 came to a grand total of \$174,313.94. Please note though that we are without a pastor and the pastor position is the largest part of our budget. That is part of the reason that receipts outpaced expenses over the summer months. Here are our results by month. Note that October included replacing HVAC units.

- The sexton fund ended the year at \$605. Please consider donating to this to keep the position funded.
- Everyone did an excellent job supporting the church over the summer. June, July, and August are usually tough financial months. However, in 2021 the same three months are collectively almost \$9,000 to the positive. That is excellent! In addition, in October we funded \$14,500 in HVAC replacement costs just out of proceeds from 2021. We did not need to dip into savings for that expense.

INCLEMENT WEATHER!

If there is a need to close church during inclement weather for ANY service, meeting, or practices, we will handle it as follows. Once the decision is made to close the church, it will appear on WHTM 27 as Big Spring U.L.C. and on Fox 43 and Channel 21 as Big Spring United Lutheran. If you do not see a closing on TV and still have a question as to whether there is a closing, you can call a council member. Donations of ice melt are always welcome.

- Please remember that we have online giving options available for use. This is a great under-utilized option to look into if you are out of town traveling often or don't want to worry with an envelope. Please remember that the church's expenses occur weekly regardless of attendance (Pastor, electricity, insurance, etc.). Online giving through Tithe.ly or Paypal is a good way to give on a consistent basis. Links are on bsulc.org to both online giving options.
